# **B.** Regional Housing Inventory Status – Information only. No action requested.

Taking our existing data, the core of which is from the census, our team is creating datasets to have a better understanding of where our housing units are. We can use this data to determine residency, which can change very quickly. The data itself is very critical because we use it to generate trips within our model, as well as on multiple other projects to determine feasibility, network traffic, and impact studies. It is centered around Calcasieu Parish, but any data we have collected is included within some parameters of this. A long-term goal is to consider construction, or units permitted for construction for this dataset. Completion is viable within the next several

weeks.

**A. Southwest Louisiana Technology Hub Status Report** – Yasic Naumenko Information only. No action requested.

Broadband: The map contestation period was recently completed, and we expect new information about broadband opportunities through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Act soon, which will be significantly larger than any other broadband effort before. Public fiber will likely be limited in scope through this funding, so we are looking for other opportunities, one of which is the USDA Reconnect Grant. Our intent is to bring public fiber throughout Jefferson Davis Parish.

ACP Outreach Grant: To the previous year we were awarded a \$150,000 grant to promote signups and outreach for the Affordable Connectivity Program, which gives a \$30 a month discount to eligible households for broadband services. ACP has run out of funding and is shutting down in April, and as a result has canceled or paused the Outreach Grant.

We are still working towards bringing the Economic Technology Enterprise centers into Oberlin, DeRidder, and Iowa.

#### VI. New Business

**A. Southwest Louisiana Regional Mobility Authority** – Mike Hollier No action is requested.

One of the key components that has come up most recently through the MPO is to reclassify the I-14 spur to I-514. This is no small effort, ranked also next to the I-10 bridge, and the transportation needs of the area are not limited to these two projects. The new governor has announced that there will be some major reform coming out of the DOTD and, in many

cases, the DOTD will not have the resources to grab federal funds or other opportunities. Depending on what this reform at the DOTD entails, I suggest that you consider a multi-jurisdictional entity that has the opportunity to reach out and grab opportunities that pop up periodically.

We are identifying a series of projects as well as programs throughout the region. There are opportunities to apply for funds through normal grantwriting channels and through the political legislative branches of government. We do not know the legislative branch and need direction on who to go to for these needs:

- 1. Legislative Representative Leads: Adjudicated Property Law
- 2. Legislative Representative Leads: Regional Public Roadway
- 3. Match Resource Fund
- 4. Legislative Representative Leads: West Louisiana Public
- 5. Coordination District
- 6. Congressional Earmark Leads: La. Region 4 Watershed
- 7. Series Reservoirs Acquisition Funding
- 8. Congressional Earmark Leads: Cameron Public Jack-Up
- 9. Multipurpose Facility.

Our 5-Page Comprehensive Plans initiative continues. Currently in review: Cameron Parish, Jefferson Davis Parish, City of Westlake, and Town of Lake Arthur.

The Town of Lake Arthur's plan focuses on mitigation of half a dozen major issues that are threatening the lake itself. The threats include the lake silting up, invasion of the apple snail, saltwater intrusion, lack of fresh water, the chico aquifer, etc.
